

Lectio Divina ["divine," or "sacred," "reading"] is the name given to a spiritual tradition among Christians over the last two thousand years, in which they attentively and prayerfully read the Word of God.

Although there is an element of study in "Lectio Divina," it is not the same as Bible Study, or exegesis, where one seeks to interpret the sacred text through analysis, and with the help of the work of scripture scholars. In Lectio Divina we seek not to master or grasp the sacred text, but rather through it prayerfully and silently to come into the presence of God. We seek to be humbly attentive to God's Holy Word, to savour it, to let it enter into our heart as much as our heads, so that it may transform us.

One approach to Lectio Divina is simply to move systematically through a book of the

Bible, but it never involves worrying about "covering" a certain quantity of text; what matters more is the quality of our humble attentiveness. We choose a small portion of the sacred text, and reflect prayerfully upon it.


Lectio Divina is not intended to increase our intellectual knowledge of the Bible (though it also has that effect); instead, it is intended to draw us closer to God, and to transform our attitudes and behaviour.

Three concepts from the Tradition:

1. Memory to Hear: We read the text aloud, or repeat it from memory (which was all that many could do in ancient times, with a lack of books – it still is a profound way of encountering the Word of God).

RESPONDING TO THE CALL

My vocation to the priesthood was nurtured in a large, Italian-American family in Rochester, New York. I am the eldest of six children and we were always surrounded by parents, grandparents and greatgrandparents who lived their faith in very ordinary ways. My vocation was also inspired by several very fine diocesan priests, some great bishops, as well as two outstanding Basilians, Frs. Bud Cullen and Albert Gaelens at the Basilian high school in Rochester. The Sisters of St. Joseph of Rochester also played key roles in my vocation story and decision to become a religious priest.

My sister, Carolyn, is a Religious Sister of Mercy in Rochester. She is one of a few sisters left teaching in school. Another sister, Lisa, is a child psychiatrist and my youngest sister, Maria, is a teacher. One brother, Bill, is a police officer and the other, John, works in personnel management in California. My mother, Rose Ann, is a retired high school language teacher. My father, Anthony, an eye doctor, died relatively young in 1997.

It's not that at one point in my life "I found God." Rather, at one moment in my life, I decided that God would be worth searching for the rest of my life. In 1982, I chose to spend the rest of my life in the Basilian Fathers, a community of priests dedicated to the work of Evangelization and Education in the Church. Did I think of other options for a career? Of course!

Fr. Thomas Rosica, CSB, turned 50 on March 3, 2009. He entered the Congregation of St. Basil (Basilian Fathers) in 1977 and took first vows in 1982. He was ordained to the priesthood on April 19, 1986, which means 23 years of ordained ministry this year. He holds dual citizenship in the USA and Canada. Fr. Rosica is usually the one inviting others to tell their story to our television audience. We invited Fr. Rosica to share some of his own story with our viewers and readers.

I thought of diplomacy in the Foreign Service, medical school, hospital chaplaincy, and teaching foreign languages. But I also knew that one concrete decision is better than a thousand options. Never in my wildest dreams did I imagine, back then, of becoming a university chaplain and lecturer in Sacred Scripture, CEO and National Director of a World Youth Day, Coordinator of a Papal Visit to Canada, superior of seminarians or Founder and CEO of a national Catholic television network!

As a Basilian I received an excellent education and formation that took me to France for my teaching year, then to Detroit for the Novitiate. From 1982-1985, I pursued my first advanced degree in Theology at Regis College in the University of Toronto. Following two fruitful years in a Basilian parish in Amherstburg, Ontario, I pursued graduate studies in Sacred Scripture at the Pontifical Biblical Institute in Rome and at the École Biblique et Archéologique Française de Jérusalem in Jerusalem.

From 1994-2000, I returned to Canada to serve as Pastor and Executive Director of the Newman Centre Catholic Mission at the University of Toronto. I also began teaching Scripture at the Toronto School of Theology. In May 1999, the Bishops of Canada appointed me to lead World Youth Day 2002 and the Papal Visit to Canada. The four-year adventure allowed me to work closely with the Vatican, bishops, young people, and lay pastoral leaders from every diocese and ecclesial movement in Canada and from 172 countries of the world. I learned how to be Catholic through that wonderful, and at times dizzying, adventure.

Following World Youth Day 2002, I had hoped to return to university work. Once again the Holy Spirit derailed things! I was invited to launch and direct the Salt + Light Television Network. My religious community also asked me to be Superior of our Formation Community in Toronto. I remained there for a little more than three years prior to being elected to the General Council of the Basilian Fathers in July 2006. I learned how to wear many hats

simultaneously, to pray much, and not to lose sleep at night and on airplane flights!

In my twenty-three years of priestly life, and several years before that as a consecrated religious, I have taught, ministered to young people and worked in the formation of priests and pastoral ministers for the Church. I am particularly grateful for the many experiences of preaching retreats to diocesan and religious priests, religious women and lay pastoral ministers in English and French-speaking Canada, the United States, and several countries of the world.

On February 26 of this year, I learned that Pope Benedict XVI had appointed me "Consultor" to the Pontifical Council for Social Communications. This honour is granted to the Church in Canada, and to the brilliant, faithful young adults who surround me at the Salt + Light Catholic Television Network. We live the words of Pope Benedict at his installation in 2005, "the Church is alive and the Church is young."

Half a century old? I don't feel it for one moment! Pope John Paul II taught me not to be afraid, and to work through the obstacles rather than allowing them to obstruct the work of Evangelization. And if anyone knew about obstacles, John Paul II did — having lived long and prospered, despite being faced from the very beginning with the tyranny of Nazism and then Communism. As we prepared for World Youth Day 2002, the Pope reminded me that as long as we keep young people close to our lives, we will remain young. The young people with whom I have had the privilege of working these past years have taught and inspired me and kept me faithful and young in mind and heart.

I can only echo the words of St. Paul in his letter to the Ephesians (3:20-21): "Now to him who by the power at work within us is able to accomplish abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine, to him be glory in the Church and in Christ Jesus to all generations, forever and ever. Amen."

Let's get on with the next 50 years. There is much work to be done. †





THE TRUE STORY OF THE WARTIME POPE'S HEROIC ACTIONS

Pope Pius XII guided the Catholic Church through two tumultuous decades, firmly establishing himself as a champion of peace, and the moral voice of a world torn apart by war. However, shortly after his death in 1958, his heroic legacy was called into question by some historians who claim that his alleged silence during the Nazi holocaust allowed Hitler to carry out his "Final Solution" against the Jews. Pope Pius XII protested vehemently the persecution of Jews. His was a prophecy in action, which saved the lives of countless victims of the neo-pagan, Nazi reign of terror, rather than potentially counter-productive public statements.

A Hand of Peace: Pope Pius XII and the *Holocaust* is an important contribution to the robust and timely debate that has arisen surrounding Pius' wartime record. Featuring interviews with world renowned Holocaust historian Sir Martin Gilbert, the Jesuit historian and postulator Fr. Peter Gumpel, author and ardent Pius defender Sr. Margherita Marchione, MPF, PhD, this gripping documentary explores the difficult choices Pius XII faced during the Second World War, and provides convincing proof that his bold, yet discreet, prophetic actions saved tens of thousands of Jewish lives and paved the way for a new era of Catholic-Jewish relations that have deepened over the past 50 years."

POPE PIUS XII'S CORONATION

The world at large will note the 70th Anniversary of Pius XII's Coronation on March 12, 2009, and commemorate the day Eugenio Pacelli, known as Pope Pius XII, received the papal tiara. His coat-of-arms showed the symbol of peace: a dove with an olive branch. His motto indicated peace to be a fruit of justice: Opus justitiae pax (ls. 34, 17).



The bells of St. Peter's pealed. There was a blaze of light at the foot of Bernini's four bronze columns and beneath the baldacchino prepared for the Coronation ceremony in St. Peter's Basilica. The bronze image of St. Peter was adorned in pontifical vestments, a tiara on the head, an ancient emerald on the finger, clasping the keys of the kingdom.

Immediately after his election, Pius XII issued a call for a peace conference of European leaders. His peace plan was based on five points: the defence of small nations, the right to life, disarmament, some new kind of League of Nations and a plea for the moral principles of justice and love. Pius XII's first radio message to the world was, "Peace, gift of God, desired by all upright men, the fruit of love and justice." In his first address to the cardinals, Pius XII spoke about peace: "We invite all men to have peace in their consciences; calm in the friendship of God; to have peace in their families, united and brought into harmony by the sacred love of Christ; and, lastly, to have peace between nations by the interchange of fraternal assistance…"

On August 24, 1939, in a last minute appeal to head off the outbreak of World War II, Pope Pius XII, stated: "I appeal again to governments and their peoples; to governments that they lay aside threats and accusations and try to settle their differences by agreement; to their peoples, that they may be calm and encourage the efforts of their government for peace. It is by force of reason and not by force of arms that justice makes progress. Empires not founded on justice are not blessed by God. Immoral policy is not successful policy... Nothing is lost by peace. Everything may be lost by war... Let men start to negotiate again."

Sadly, the pope's appeal was not heeded. Soon after, World War II began. †

We start with the sacred text itself. We need to be immersed in it. We read it, or repeat it from memory, aloud again and again. We go, not to commentaries, but to the Word itself.

2. Intellect to Know: We need to reflect on the sacred text, for it is Light for our path. This is why we need to see the context of the passage, and be aware of the background and purpose of the text. What was the original intent of the human author? We also use our imagination to enter into the text, and to see it from the perspective of those who are in it. We reflect

on how it is connected to the whole of God's plan, from Old to New Testament, and see the connections. We think about how it speaks to us today.

3. Will to Love: In our loving attentiveness to the Word of God in Scripture, we open our hearts to the Word of God: Jesus our Lord. We spend time with the one we love, through our prayerful reading of Scripture, and we resolve to serve him faithfully. Lectio Divina always involves time in silent adoration of the Lord, and a resolution to let our lives be deeply transformed by God's Word.

One Sunday evening each month, all are welcome to join Archbishop Collins, for *Lectio Divina* at St. Michael's Cathedral. The evening begins with Vespers (Evening Prayer) at 7:00pm, followed by Lectio Divina from 7:30-8:15pm.

Salt + Light Television broadcasts each *Lectio Divina* the following Sunday. The patriarch of the family, Gaetano Gagliano, who is a wise business man (founded St. Joseph Printing in 1956 with a single letterpress operation in the basement of his home and grew the business steadily to become the largest privately owned communications company in Canada) was far-sighted, not just in his business endeavours but in all things in his life. As a devout Catholic man, he saw it as his responsibility to spread the good news of his faith far and wide; and what better way than to use the extraordinary potential of the medium of television. It was shortly after World Youth Day in 2002 that his vision was realized and Salt + Light Television was born.

His program, In Conversation, broadcast in Italian, continues to be well received by our Italian-speaking audience and on Telelatino (TLN). FOUNTAIN OF LOVE AND LIFE |



The Chinese ministry of Salt + Light Television has been broadcasting the locally produced program Fountain of Love and Life (FLL) since 2006. This ministry made a huge step forward in January 2009 when its programs began broadcasting on Fairchild Television, the biggest, national, Chinese television channel in Canada. Now, Chinese audiences from across the country can watch FLL every Sunday at 4:35pm local time (Eastern Time or Pacific Time) on Fairchild Television. FLL also launched a weekly, 1-hour, Cantonese radio program on Fairchild Radio (AM1430) at the same time. The program airs every Saturday between 6-7pm (Eastern Time).

Fr. Daniel Chui, CSB and Fr. Andrew Leung, CSB are the content advisors for FLL's programs. Run by more than 100 volunteers, Fountain of Love and Life Ministry, as it has now come to be known, keeps its audience posted with the help of the four Chinese parishes in Toronto, their website **www.FLL.cc**, the newly created Outreach Team, various promotional activities, and their regular newsletter FLL Spotlight. They raise their own funds through donations and sponsorships. Over 600 people attended their Annual Fundraising Gala last November where more than \$100,000 was raised. That speaks volumes of their evangelization effort.

"We hope to bring Christ not only to Chinese viewers in Canada, but globally, especially to our brothers and sisters in China," Paul Yeung, overall coordinator of FLL, told lampstand. Mandarin programs are definitely one of their targets for the future.

Javier, can you describe your job at Salt + Light Television?

As Technical Operations
Manager, my primary job is to
transmit our television programs
in the clearest possible way to
the widest possible audience
with the technology available.
I am always looking for ways
to improve and stretch the
capacity of our technology in
order to increase the reach of our
programs. I also direct and edit
programs.

Where is Salt + Light in terms of its technology?

Salt + Light Television is a digital channel comparable to most other television stations, with about the same level of equipment and technology. At Salt + Light we stretch technology to the maximum capacity. For example, we recently started receiving France's KTO programs via new technology. This unique way to receive a program feed is part of our ongoing learning process.

How long have you been part of Salt + Light and what brought you here?

ROBERT GALEA RESPONDING TO GOD'S CALL

When did you hear God's call?

For me, God's call began as a desire to serve and developed through many life circumstances that were pointing me towards priesthood.

What was the turning point in your life?
